# MSCTC On-Line In-Service Training DACOTA Spotlight – December 2021

Through a training partnership with MSCTC, the National Institute for Jail Operations provides Michigan agencies with engaging legal-based online training through DACOTA —NIJO's Detention and Corrections Online Training Academy. All DACOTA curriculum is approved for all levels of NIJO Professional Certification (NCCO, NCCS, and NCCE).

Currently, the DACOTA Catalog contains 69 online courses providing 75 CEUs of corrections-specific training based on what the law requires for running safe and secure facilities. As of the end of December, Michigan DACOTA online learners have completed 6,479 courses and 7,018 credit hours. As of the end of the year, 52 Michigan agencies have learners getting trained in the DACOTA platform. # REMINDER: IMPORTANT CHANGES TO ANNUAL IN-SERVICE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

The following changes were implemented to the annual in-service training requirements for Local Corrections Officers beginning January 2021:

- 1) Two (2) hours per year of Mental Health training required as part of the yearly 20-hour in-service requirement.
- 2) No more than 5-hours of the 20-hour in-service training requirement can be comprised of Firearms training.

To ensure Agency compliance, enter the training that will count as the required 2-hours of mental health training under the 'Mental Health' category in the Local Corrections Officer Tracking System (LCOTS) with a description of the in-service course attended in the 'Remarks' section.
